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Project Transformation's is transforming communities by engaging **Children**, **College students**, and **Churches** in purposeful relationships, because PT envisions a world that is rooted in love, pursues the equity of all people, and amplifies God's call on every life.

PT's approach to community transformation: The 3 Cs

- **Children** from overburdened neighborhoods improve their literacy, social-emotional, and spiritual development through participating in summer literacy focused camps.
- **College** students invest in the lives of children through paid internships and living in community, exploring their calling, and developing as servant leaders.
- **Churches** wrap around PT's out-of-school time programs, reconnecting and building relationships.

This collaborative model of ministry harnesses the creative energy and leadership of college-age young adults, who live in intentional Christian community, run literacy focused summer camps for children in overburdened neighborhoods while exploring their call. The programs are held at site churches and supported by partner churches thereby helping churches connect in meaningful ways with their communities.




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
